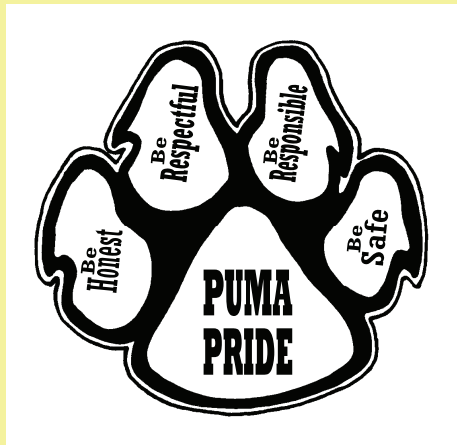

Students of various ages and ranges of ability can receive academic instruction in the least restrictive and most inclusive manner possible in the student's own community.

- **Subjects:** Reading, Writing, Mathematics
- **Grades:** K-12
- **Place(s) of Service:** School Sites or homes
- **Student Population Served:** General Education, Special Education, and ELL
- **Time of Service:** Before School, After School, Weekends
- **Student/Instructor Ratio:** 1-2 students for every 1 instructor
- **Cost:** free to eligible child
- **Transportation:** not provided
