



Student Medications Pertaining to Sports

Emergency medications such as inhalers to treat asthma, or a cartridge injectors (Epi-pens) for medically diagnosed allergic conditions are vital to have on hand during all intramural or interscholastic athletic events to protect the student against serious harm or death. To be in accordance with this state law and our school policies and procedures, the following is a guideline for parents that will assist with preparing students for athletic events.

The parents need to:

- 1) Obtain a **completed** medication order form for the required medication(s) needed.

You may obtain our form from the health office, main office or on the district website at www.colchesterct.org. Go to Bacon Academy tab, nurse office tab, scroll to bottom to find *Medication Authorization Form**.

*Our form has **three sections**;

- **The TOP** is the medication order and is to be completed by physician.
- **The MIDDLE** is for parent/guardian authorization for the school to administer the medication.
- **The BOTTOM** is to allow for the student to self administer (student able to carry their own medication) the medication.

The first 2 sections must be filled out completely and signed by all parties. **IF the student has permission to carry and self administer their medication (such as inhalers, Epi-pen) then the bottom section MUST be signed again by the physician AND parent/guardian.**

- 2) Medication(s), along with the **completed** form, must be brought into the Bacon Academy health office no later than 2 weeks **BEFORE** sports tryouts.

The health office has limited hours available throughout the Summer months. Please make arrangements to schedule a drop off.
